

What is a potato dance?

Whether you've lived in Louisiana a long time or not, you've probably heard the expression "Lâche pas la patate!" It means "Don't drop the potato!" You may have thought it came from Jimmy C. Newman's big Nashville hit song by the same name, but it's really from a traditional dance competition which was adopted from Native Americans by Cajun and Creole people on the Louisiana prairie. Though the dance is rare these days, it was still very popular "way back when" because the winners of the dance would leave with something as valuable as a whole sack of potatoes!



Not feeling the excitement yet? No? That's ok. We realize that a sack of potatoes is a less thrilling commodity these days, and we're having potato trophies made. Now we're talking!! Who wouldn't want a potato trophy?

We'll have one potato dance for children and one for adults, and the rules are simple:

- 1. You have to actually be dancing.
- 2. You have to keep your hands behind your back.
- 3. Lâche pas la patate or else you're out! The last dance partners who've still got their potato win.



General Information:

Attendance/check-ins and -outs:

If your child is going to be absent, please do not call us. You can **email us** or just send the doctor's excuse in their green folder when they return to school. We can also accept a handwritten parental excuse. Parental excuses can only cover two consecutive days of absence. If your child is sick longer than that, you will need a doctor's excuse to have the extra days covered. Any excuse must be received within five days of the absence.

If you are running late, please remember to sign in your child in the office when you get here. You do not need to let us know in advance.

If you need to check your child out early, please come to the office to sign him out before 3:15

p.m. You do not need to let us know in advance unless you have an official reason for needing to check your child out between 3:15 and 3:45. In that case, please **email us.**

Transportation changes:

If your child is usually a bus-rider but you will be picking him or her up today, or vice-versa, or if you need to leave your child in afternoon Lion Care today, please **email us** before 3:15 p.m. Please do not call us with this information.

Please avoid calling the office.

We need to be able to call out when we have sick children or emergencies. Please email us instead of calling whenever possible.
