#### Louisiana Farm to School!

October is National Farm-to-School Month, and to celebrate, we have decided to participate in the Louisiana Farm-to-School Challenge! This program aims to connect students with healthy local food, strengthen the local economy, and enrich local communities through school gardening, local food procurement, and education.

We will make regular announcements in our newsletter about our participation, but throughout the year students will be introduced to fruits and vegetables many have never tried before, new ways to enjoy the produce they already know, and they will learn about the availability of fresh food, as well as places they can go locally to share their new interests with their families, such as local farms and farmer's markets.

October's Harvest of the Month (La récolte du mois) is the cucumber. This month, second graders will have a French-language tour of Le Potager d'Acadiana in Arnaudville, a working organic farm. They will also make refrigerator pickles in class. We are trying to start a school garden and still looking for donations of boards, soil, and tools like a shovel and a pitchfork. The second graders have started sprouting seeds for our school garden, which will be tended by their class and the Lion of the Week.

Other classes will have a mini-lesson each month on an in-season fruit or vegetable with fun classroom activities and a taste test.





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#### Lion of the Week

As we mentioned in last month's newsletter, we have started selection Lions of the Week again. However, unlike last year, when we had one from each grade, this year we are choosing one student from the whole school each week.

The Lion of the Week is chosen on his or her merit, staying true to our school goals of being

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everyday. These are students who rise above their classmates by participating in class, helping others, and generally being outstanding students.

As they have shown us they can handle their responsibilities, they get to do extra jobs during their week of recognition, including helping distribute papers to the classrooms, helping other students with their work, helping scan ID cards at lunch, helping Madame Lindsay with the morning announcements, and other helpful tasks to show the whole school what an École Saint-Landry Lion of the Week can do.

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#### **Continuing French at Home**

You can easily help your child continue learning at home. Just switching the language to French for one episode of their favorite cartoon, for example, will help your child's brain get used to transitioning to French, and maybe even teach them some extra vocabulary! On écrit sur les murs--Kids United


La meilleure--Wejdene
