



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Our mouths sure do have to make some funny shapes while we're learning to pronounce foreign sounds!


Settling In


This is such an intense time for everyone. Parents, kids, and teachers alike have to get used to new schedules, new people, and new places. New students and teachers also have to get used to a new language!




School Lunch Reminder

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PBIS Store!





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Continuing French at Home

You can easily help your child continue learning at home. Just switching the language to French for one episode of their favorite cartoon, for example, will help your child's brain get used to transitioning to French, and maybe even teach them some extra vocabulary! And there are tons of French videos for kids on YouTube that are easy to understand.

Listening to music is another fun way to get them hearing more French at home. Some of the songs they have been enjoying in music class are:

Older children can find videos with lyrics and pause them to see which words they recognize. Try to get your kids to do this and write down the words they know on one page, and the words they don't know on another page.
