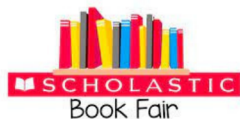
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Grandparents' Picnics

Building Mental Health Awareness in Schools

At École Saint-Landry, teachers and staff alike remain mindful about the mental health of our students. Mrs. Jessica works with our students through sessions that explore topics such as promoting positive self-esteem through building resilience, reducing stigma, preventing bullying, and recognizing when to talk to an adult. She teaches students skills to resolve interpersonal conflicts and reminds them of their strengths, just how much is within their power to manage. Promoting self-esteem sets the stage for a supportive and inclusive school environment where students can thrive academically, emotionally, and socially.

Our students know that when they need a space to relax and gather their thoughts, they have trusted adults who will welcome them into a calm space and with whom they can discuss their concerns privately. Some students visit when they need a hug or they miss mom, some visit when they are feeling overwhelmed and want to sit quietly in the office for a bit or take a walk outside for a few minutes with a staff member.

We take the mental health of our students very seriously because we genuinely care about them and their emotional well-being. This is not only done in our SEL classes, when children are allowed time to express their feelings and concerns, but also just through informal conversations. Our students know that every staff member has an open-door policy and we've got their backs!

Academic success is so much more than just studying. That is why we take bullying and even minor aggressions so seriously. Our goal is for every student to succeed.
